## **EUROPEAN PEACE ROUTE**

*The ENPP project for 2012*

The creation and development of the *European Peace Route (EPR)* is one of the main tasks of the Association ENPP for 2012 that will start to be discussed in the 6<sup>th</sup>. European Meeting scheduled for the city of Zadar (Croatia), this spring. In Europe there are over 200 places across almost all countries where were signed Peace Treaties and Conventions, generically referred as *places of peace*, which is already a trademark owned by the association.

The *European Peace Route (EPR)* is a virtual road based on the European *places of peace*, whether they are current members of the Network or that will formalize its membership in the future. The main objective of *EPR* is the development of cultural tourism around the Peace.

The *European Peace Route* is also intended to be recognized as a Cultural Route of the Council of Europe.

### **June, 1 and 2, 2012:**

#### **6<sup>th</sup>. MEETING OF ENPP IN ZADAR (Croatia)**

The 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the European Network of Places of Peace is already scheduled to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2012, in the Croatian city of Zadar, under the invitation of the Mayor of Zadar, Mr. Živko Kolega.

The city of Zadar is situated in the Adriatic Sea Coast and there was signed the Peace Treaty of Zadar, in 1358. After the signing of this Treaty, the city returned back to the crown of the Croatian-Hungarian King Louis I and a period of great prosperity and strategic importance of the city throughout the region was opened.

This meeting will coincide with the completion of the 2<sup>nd</sup> AGM of the Association where is expected the membership of new members from other European countries.



#### **VASVÁR (Hungary) - The newest member of ENPP**

The city of Vasvár, located in the western region of Hungary is the newest member of ENPP, whose membership was formalized on 27th January. A delegation of the city participated as a guest on the 5<sup>th</sup>. ENPP Meeting held in the city of Trencin (Slovakia) in October 2011.

Despite its small size, the city has a rich historical heritage, which stands out the peace treaty known as Peace of Vasvár signed on 10 August 1664 which ended the Austro-Turkish War of 1663-1664.

The membership of this Hungarian city increases to nine the number of European countries already represented in ENPP.
